<u>MATHS</u>

The Willows will be looking at number recognition and counting accurately. The children will begin to recognise numbers to 10 and beyond and will learn different strategies to count objects. They will begin to understand and use the vocabulary of 'more and less' and to use the vocabulary associated with addition and subtraction. A great way to support your child in Maths is by carrying out simple activities at home such as going on a number hunt or grouping and counting toys.
