Physical Education

In PE this term, the Year Twos will be participating in team games and developing simple tactics for attacking and defending. They will be able to send and receive the ball in different ways. Alongside this, the children will be learning skills in gymnastics and dance as they run simultaneously alongside invasion games.

Art and/or Design Technology

This term, the class are focusing on the artist Valerie Davide. They will use charcoal, chalk and pencil when learning about tone and texture. Over the next few weeks, the children will create tonal scales by exploring how the amount of pressure applied impacts the tone of an image. They will explore line, form and shadow when examining 3D pictures and will focus on creating depth when drawing.

<u>Music</u>

As musicians, our focus this term us musicianship and the question 'How does music help us to make friends?' We are using charanga to help us learn information while we listen and respond, identify, copy and repeat. We will also spend some time learning songs and preparing for our harvest festival and the Christmas service (yes I said it)!

<u>Science</u>

Our science learning this term is all about materials. We are going to predict, observe and record our findings on different experiments this term. Looking at materials for resistance, absorbency and materials that bend, stretch and twist. The children will get to explore many materials from our environment, as well as materials that aren't usually there!

<u>History</u>

As historians, we will be exploring the significance of the sinking of the Titanic in 1912 and where this fits into our history timeline of units taught so far. Why was it special onboard and why the journey was taken. We will have a talk from the RLNI lifeboat crew and a cruise company to explore how disasters like this can be avoided in the future and why more people weren't able to be rescued.

Geography

As geographers, we are going to be starting our term by looking deeper into the United Kingdom and weather patterns. A convenient time to be looking at weather patterns at the start of the year as it is so unpredictable! The children will use their skills and knowledge of map work and their skills of prediction and comparison throughout the unit.
