Science in The Beeches

The Beeches thoroughly enjoyed our Science experiment this week. We were learning about the inventor John Dunlop and realising the impact that he has had on our world today. We wouldn't have such comfy cars if it wasn't for him! The children were inspired to learn how he made tyres and why. We went on to test different balls made from different materials to see how far they travelled when dropped down a ramp. Sadly, all of our photos are a little blurry, but we enjoyed measuring how far they travelled, and we discovered that the tennis ball travelled the furthest! Maybe we have some budding inventors in our class already? We can't wait to experiment again next half term with our new unit.

The Monkey Puzzles have been on their residential trip to Beam House in north Devon. Reading for Pleasure in The Hollies

The Hollies had a virtual author visit with Helena Duggan this week. She has written several books including the series A Place Called Perfect and The Light Thieves. Her books are centred around young adventurous, courageous lead characters who take on intrepid challenges to save the world from evil. Aspiring Artists in The Maples

They have explored the natural resources used to create the paints for the paintings and this week, have planned and created their very own cave paintings. Each one tells a unique story centred around life in the Stone Age. The children are incredibly proud of their creations.







Artist Visit in The Oaks

Oaks class had a real treat this week when our current focus artist, Amelia Webster, visited Ilsham to talk about her life, works, inspirations, techniques and use of her sketchbook. The children were simply wowed to see how Amelia used a variety of techniques and mediums (oil, charcoal and pastels) in her work and loved seeing the original versions of the art that they had been studying. It was amazing to feel the buzz in the room as the children heard the stories behind the art and the moment-in-time they capture they from the artist herself.







From the Office

Please remember to book your child's appointment for the flu nasal spray immunisation <u>via this link</u>. The school's unique ID number is DV137304. The portal will close to bookings on Friday 3rd November. The team will be in school on Tuesday 7th November, and they will not be able to immunise any children without prior consent having been given. There is also going to be limited capacity for mop up clinics afterwards, so if you do wish your child to have the nasal spray, then please do book them in for the school session.

A reminder that, according to the Trust's Absence and Attendance Policy, no absences on the first and last day of a half term will be authorised, including illness unless it is supported with medical evidence.

5. Authorised/Unauthorised absence

Pupils are expected to attend the academy every day and this is key for children's education as well as their mental heath. All absences must be explained by a parent/carer see section below on First Day Reporting. With reference to, and guided by, the DfE's guidance for schools on attendance, the academy will set out if their attendance can be authorised or not.

Acceptable reasons for the authorisation of absences are:

- Illness (1)
- Exceptional family circumstances such as a bereavement
- 3. Days of religious observance
- 4. Unavoidable medical/dental appointments (2)

Absences from the academy will not be authorised for:

1. Absences not agreed, this will always include first and last day of half term unless medical evidence provided
