
Open Sports Community Activity Recovery

Relationship and Health Education in The Hollies

Our RHE focus for the start of this term has been respecting ourselves and others. Each child is supported to understand themselves and others: families, communities and the wider world. This week, Hollies explored

Our aim is to help children develop positive and healthy relationships and the classroom is a safe place for children to discuss ideas and ask questions about families and relationships. We looked at blended families, foster families, extended families.....and everything in between. The children showed real compassion and insight and a positive sense of awareness, and respect for others.



SEND Graduated Response

On Monday, we joined together as a staff, led by Miss Davies (SENDCO) to review our graduated response – our approach to supporting pupils with additional needs. It was incredibly powerful for our staff to collaborate together as we refine our systems and approaches to support all children. We will continue to engage in the latest research and work closely with partner agencies to provide the best provision possible for our children. We will be joined by the SEND Team from Torbay Council on 7th November as part of their roadshow and we look forward to sharing that with you.

The Rowans as Historians

As historians, the Rowans have been questioning 'what were toys like in the year I was born?' The children observed different toys that were around the time they were born looking at how the toys worked, what they were made of, what could they do and what they are used for. As a class we looked at how the toys were similar or different and how we know they are used in the present day.









The Willows

This week the Willows have been learning about the seasons and what changes we see in the autumn. The children went for a lovely walk to the garden to observe the trees and the leaves. They then collected leaves to make a lovely autumn picture. The children brought conkers in, and they have been practicing their counting and even making words with their conkers!







PE in the Oaks

The Oaks class have thoroughly enjoyed keeping active during their PE sessions this week. Earlier in the week, during gymnastics, the class perfected a series of jumps and balances and used these to form sequences with their partners. During our invasion games lesson, the class focused on using the correct footwork during competitive sports. Our Kinetics PE teacher was extremely impressed with how the class have already developed their understanding of a range of skills so far this term.



Realising the Possible

Reading Aspirations in the Maples

The Maples were Realising the Possible in their reading for pleasure session this week. They were diving into the magical world of books and stories, with a special focus on finding inspiration to become an author. They embarked on a journey through different genres and authors to ignite their passion for reading. The children were mesmerised with the 'Little People, Big Dreams' books and it allowed them to realise they can also follow in the footsteps of many of the famous people and aim for their 'big dreams'.



Artists in Monkey Puzzles

This week in Monkey Puzzles, the children have been focussing their learning as artists on a local artist, Simon Drew. Simon has his own art gallery in Dartmouth and the children were able to recall having seen his artwork in various places they have visited in the local area. It has been wonderful to for the children to be exposed to the work of a local artist, whose work has been inspired by his studies in Zoology at Exeter University, and to begin to consider what is possible for themselves in the future!
