Children in Need



The children really enjoyed the challenge, and this activity will help to strengthen the muscles in their little hands, to enable them to hold a pencil correctly and then form letters perfectly. One of the barriers a child can face when it comes to reading is the barrier of just not knowing what kind of book you fancy reading! This week, Hollies had a book blanket session where we covered the tables on a broad variety of books of different genres to try and overcome this conundrum. Firstly, we laterally judged a book by its cover and the children perused what was on offer, recording the books they liked the look of. Many actually said it was quite frustrating, as they were desperate to pick up the books to have a look at the blurbs, or to take a glance at the first few pages – something we take for granted when selecting a new read. The children then got their hands on the actual books and shared their experiences with the class. Children said they ended up being interested in some books that they would never normally have tried, and the session opened their eyes to genre that they didn't know about, such as historical fiction.







Reading Rivers in Monkey Puzzles

The children in Monkey Puzzles have been reflecting on their habits as readers this week and discussing how many things they read within a day. They talked about what surprised them about the things they were reading (without realising), the importance of needing to use reading in everyday life and also how they will need to use reading in their future careers. It was wonderful to see the thought that each child had put into producing their reading river and it was very special to hear the buzz and excitement within the classroom!
