## Design and Technology in The Beeches

We are delighted to share the exciting happenings in The Beeches class this week. Our Year 2s have discovered a newfound passion for the skill of sewing! Under the guidance of Miss Rowe-Jones and a few experts in the class, we have been exploring the running stitch in preparation for making our Christmas stockings. This was



our first attempt at this craft and the children have fully immersed themselves into the world of sewing. Not only have they honed their stitching techniques, but they have also begun to realise the potential that lies within this skill. The joy and pride on their faces as they were practicing was truly heartwarming. We cannot wait to see their creativity and perseverance flourish as they continue this exciting journey.

#### Scientific Enquiry in The Hollies

The children continued their scientific enquiry into electrical circuits this week. We used problem solving and observing and measuring to make our own switches with everyday objects such as paperclips, tin foil and split pins. Through trial and error, the children persevered to create working circuits that contained homemade switches that could be opened and closed. The amazement and awe when they succeeded in lighting the bulb or buzzing a buzzer was a great thing to behold.



## Writing in the Oaks

This week, we have been enjoying learning all about the life and achievements of Sir David Attenborough and writing our own versions of his biography in our writing lessons. The children have honed their skills as writers and have mastered a variety of skills: adverbial phrases, repetition for effect, dashes for parenthesis and subordination. I have been wowed by the way the class have mastered these skills. Impressively, a number of the class have also been challenging themselves to use colons and semi-colons in their work. Additionally, we have spent time practising our letter formation. I am very much looking forward to the class writing their own independent biographies next week.

#### Scientists in Monkey Puzzles

This week, the children in Year 6 have been continuing to learn about light and, as part of this, focussing on the eye. They were amazed by the effects of light on the sizing of the pupil and they were able to investigate this by observing what happens to the eye in both darkness and light; there was so much excitement! The children also learnt about the important career of opticians and the role they play in maintaining eye health.

## Virtual Author Event in the Maples

On Wednesday morning, the Maples were lucky enough to take part in a virtual author session with poet Joshua Siegal. They were introduced to some of his work and were mesmerised by it. It produced lots of laughter and smiles across the classroom. Joshua Siegal then took the children step by step through poetry writing and they ended the session writing their very own poem in the style of Joshua's work. They are looking forward to getting some of his books in the Maples classroom to explore further.
