This collaborative effort underscores our commitment to continuous improvement and ensures that our assessment practices remain robust and reflective of the high standards we set for our students.

SEND Leads Together

On Wednesday, Miss Davies joined the rest of the SENDCos from across the trust along with our Director of Vulnerable pupils, to discuss SEND development and how we are approach it consistently in all our schools. They gathered to look at the principles of fostering an inclusive culture, evaluating systems and structures that contribute to developing inclusive classrooms. Practical adaptations in the classroom were discussed to enhance inclusivity. SEND leads also shared how teachers within their school are adapting and using the Graduated Response document to support and meet the needs of our learners with additional needs.

An Exciting Artist Visit



On Monday, Years 4 and 5 were lucky enough to get a visit from Plymouth based 'naive artist' Brian Pollard. The children loved meeting him and asked him wonderful questions such as, 'Where do you get your inspiration from, and how long does it take to paint each piece?'

We then went on to have a workshop with him where he broke the painting process down into easy-to-follow steps. He used geometric shapes to explain how he paints the features and characters in his paintings. A sitting cat is simply a circle on top of a triangle, a standing dog is two rectangles on 4 sticks, with two triangles for ears, a cloud is a series of circles, and so on. With this knowledge, all the children were confident to create their own piece of work inspired by his style. The final pieces are fantastic and I'm sure they will be adorning your fridge doors soon.





Dental Health Visit in The Beeches

On Thursday, the Beeches were visited by the Dental Outreach Team at Peninsula Dental Social Enterprise. During this session on oral health education, the children were introduced to an animated character, Geoffrey the Giant, who doesn't like to look after his teeth and has never



visited the dentist. With the help of his friends Geoffrey learnt some important key oral health messages which are vital to help keep his mouth and teeth healthy. During this interactive session, the Beeches learnt all about the importance of oral health.
