Artwork in the Willows

The children eagerly experimented, blending primary colours with brushes and even their fingers, joyfully discovering the art of crafting new shades.

Exploring the Romans in the Maples

This week in History, the Maples had their first lesson exploring their new unit of the Romans. They spent the lesson exploring the key question 'Who were the Romans and where did they come from?'. The children were able to make connections with their previous History unit of the Stone Age to the Iron Age, when they looked at the timeline to see when in History the Roman Empire ruled. Throughout the lesson, they were raising questions that created an in-depth discussion amongst all children in the class which was an exciting way to kick off the Roman unit. It was lovely to see how eager the children were to put their new knowledge in their books during their independent work.

History in the Beeches

Our Year Twos have had a fantastic first week back and have blown us away with their incredible passion for learning in all lessons across the curriculum. As a class of very keen historians, they were eager to dive straight into our new history unit this term which focuses on the Great Fire of London. During our session this week, the class examined a range of historic images to determine what life was like in London during the 1600s. The children were tasked with creating a collage to represent a street scene of London during this period of time. They worked hard to represent the confined conditions that many families were living in and we were blown away at their creativity this week.

Realising the Possible

<u>The Black Art Movement, Womens' Rights and Climate Change in Monkey Puzzles</u> This week, the children in Year 6 have been focussing on inequality within our world and those people who have been inspirational in bringing about change, impacting on how we live now and our lives in the future.

As historians, they have started to learn about the inequality between classes and gender in the Victorian Era and have worked to use sources to deepen their understanding. As artists, we have been focussing on Lubaina Himid, a key black, female artist who championed the way for female black artists in the 1980's and paved the way for them to have their work recognised and viewed. She was also renown for addressing inequalities within race, gender and classes during this time.

Finally, the children have been continuing their work on climate change, researching key information and statistics to support their persuasive writing.

They children have been incredible at voicing their views this week and it has been wonderful to see how their understanding that they, as individuals, are able to change the world.

Brian Pollard's Art in The Hollies

This week the children have had their introduction into the work of local artist Brian Pollard. We discussed his use of colour and subject, and the emotions these colours evoke in us when we look at his work. We compared his work to that of Henry Moore, whom we studied last term, and discussed how each artist made us feel different emotions and how each artist holds a different place in art history. Building on from the work with colour that the children did in Year 3, they then



completed a colour wheel using primary colours then mixed their own secondary and tertiary colours.



Science in the Oaks

Oaks have had a brilliant first week back at school – every child has returned motivated to learn following their break. In Science, the class have started their new Forces topics. We began by exploring what a force is and the different types of force at work in our world. We discussed the work of Issac Newton and the difference between mass and weight. The children enjoyed using force metres to measure forces in the classroom and observing different forces in action (including, gravity, upthrust and air resistance). I was very impressed with how the class worked scientifically in their groups to take and record accurate measurements.
