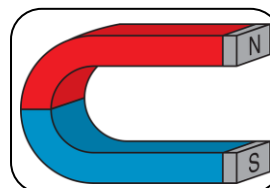

ENGLISH

In English this term, the children will be 'writing to persuade' as they look at Christmas dessert adverts to gather persuasive skills, before using them to create their own advert. Later on in the term, they write a letter or persuasion to their pencils. The children will build on their knowledge of audience and purpose throughout their sentence stacking lessons.

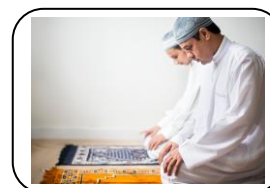
SCIENCE

To begin the half term, the children will be investigating forces and magnets. The children will carry out fair tests to observe how things move on different surfaces and how magnets attract or repel to each other. In the second half of the term, the children will be looking at plants and the main things they need to be able to grow, flourish and survive



R.E

During this half term, they will be learning about how festivals and worship show what matters to Muslims. They will then move on to focus on how festivals and family life show what matters to Jewish people.



MATHS

In Maths this half-term, the Maples will be building on their knowledge of multiplication and division, length and perimeter, fractions and mass and capacity. The children will learn a variety of different strategies to help them to problem solve and use across their maths learning. The children will continue to grow as mathematical thinkers as they provide reasoning as to why they have selected certain methods to solve their questions.

HISTORY

The focus for history this half term is invasion and power. As Historians, the children will be looking at the events that took place during the period of the Romans. The key question they will be focusing on is 'What was the impact of the Roman invasion on Britain?'. The children will be focusing on the invasion, the success of the Roman army and the romanisation of Exeter.

GEOGRAPHY

The children will be carrying out a comparison study where they will look at geographical similarities and differences between a region in the UK (Exeter) and in a European country (Rome). They will focus on using maps, atlases and aerial photos to identify key features of settlements. The children will also be able to explain how urban areas have been located near specific physical features and their importance.



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Physical Education

In P.E the Maples will be beginning their Spring term by focusing on building their fielding and striking skills before moving on to focus on invasion games. Over the course of the Spring lessons, the children will focus on developing their skills to be able to play rounders, tennis, football and build their athletic skills. This will be

MFL (French)

The children will continue to build upon their knowledge of the language of French by beginning their spring half term by learning a range of animals in French. For the second half term, the children will move on to learning the phrases 'I am able to...' and 'I am not able to...'. They will complete the phrases by adding some activities onto the end of them.

Art and/or Design Technology

In Art, we will be looking at a local artist called Becky Bettesworth. The children will build on their knowledge of Becky Bettesworth where they will create their own travel poster. In Design Technology, the Maples will be looking at simple programming and control. They will design and produce a noise-making toy vehicle triggered by changes in its environment.

Computing

The Maples will be looking at programming in the first half term and will be creating a sequence in music. They will identify that commands have an outcome and through doing this they will recognise that a sequence of commands can have an order. In the second half term, the children will go on to focus on data and information branching into databases. They will look at identifying the object attributes needed to collect relevant data and explaining why it is helpful for databases to be well structured.

MUSIC

As musicians, the Maples will be focusing on composition and improvisation. They will focus on composing using their imagination and looking at the key question of 'How does music make the world a better place.' They will then focus on singing, listening and learning words and songs in preparation for their Easter service.

RELATIONSHIPS AND HEALTH EDUCATION In RHE, the focus for the first half of Spring term is 'Belonging to a community'. The children will look at what rules and laws are and the consequences that come alongside them if either are broken. They will focus on how they can be expected to be treated with respect by others and that in turn they should show respect to others. In the second half of term, the children will move on to looking at the units of 'Media literacy and Digital resilience; and 'Money and Work'. They will explore the risks associated the positives of using the internet and how to make safe and reliable choices. They will also explore stereotypes within jobs and to recognise the skills they have that might link to future jobs.
