Removing Barriers

The Rowans as Musicians

As musicians the Rowans have been curious and questioning, 'how music can make the world a better place?' The children have engaged in lively discussions about differences, exploring the concept through finding the pulse and experimenting with their voices. The children have been using pitch pencils, matching their voices to different tones and applying this skill to sing along with various songs.



French in the Oaks Class

This half term in French the children have been working on answering the question: Quel temps fait-il? We have been repeating and recognising the vocabulary for weather in French, asking and saying what the weather is like today and describing the weather in different regions of France using a weather map with symbols. This week, the children were able to showcase their new knowledge by creating their own weather report in French. It was brilliant to see the children confidently create and perform these for the class.





French in the Maples

The Maples have been learning 10 different animals in French this half term. They have been focusing on 5 different animals each lesson and rehearsing these by repeating them, playing games associated to the vocabulary and completing the French vocabulary book. This week, the children carried out their end of unit assessment. The results from the assessment really reflected how hard the children have been working on their French. Well done, Maples!

Global Citizens in Monkey Puzzles

This week, Year 6 have continued to focus their learning in RE on the worldview Hinduism. They have been considering the concepts of Samsara, Karm and Dharma and how reading holy scriptures can have an impact on the life of a Hindu. The children have also been discussing the importance of being able to disagree-well and have knowledgeable conversations with people of different worldviews to ensure there is no prejudice within communities.



Realising the Possible

The Hollies as Climate Activists.

Our focus for the climate change workshop was freshwater systems. We started with an introduction to our climate in Britain, its characteristics and what freshwater systems are. The children were then all blown away by Hayley's toilet roll timeline; ask them, it was truly fabulous. After some activities; poster making, environmental snap, and climate change snakes and ladders, the children wrote down what they currently do the help the environment, what they would like to do the help the environment and what they were going to go home and tell their family about the



environment. The workshop has already had a great impact on a few of our children who have penned a persuasive letter to Mr Grinsill asking to arrange a litter pick. The purpose of the workshop was to empower the children to affect change, so watch out for a litter pick coming soon to a street near you.

Snack and Maths in The Willows

The Willows developed their grasp of the composition of 5 by demonstrating the creation of two groups from five little people, showcasing a practical understanding of numerical concepts and fostering collaborative learning. The children gathered around the snack table, delighting in their fruit and milk while engaging in lively discussions about mathematical concepts. Amidst munching and chatting, they explored numbers, shapes, and sizes, turning the snack time into an enjoyable and educational experience.
