Realising the Possible

Sowing Sweet Peas in the Rowans

This week Miss Davies brought in some sweet peas for us to plant. She told the Rowans that once the seeds started growing, they would need a strong and sturdy structure to grow and climb up. So as designers and constructors, the Rowans got to work at researching different garden structures. They thought about what the structures are made from and what sort of designs they liked and disliked. As a whole class they then created a design brief thinking about: what are they making? What do they want to achieve with the design? Who is the target audience? And what should the product do?







Geography in the Beeches

Excitingly, the Beeches have started their new geography unit! Over the next six weeks, the Year Twos will be exploring the physical and human features of two contrasting locations and will be discussing how these features affect land use. As an introduction to our new unit, the Beeches used a range of geographical terms to identify physical features of different areas; some of these words included beach, cliff, forest, hill, mountain, sea, coast, ocean, river, soil and vegetation. The children sorted a whole range of images into physical (naturally occurring) features and manmade features before using their geography skills to label various maps and images.

Symmetry in The Willows

The Willows had an engaging week exploring symmetry both inside and outside the classroom. They delved into the concept through natural objects, pictures, and even their own bodies, discovering the beauty of symmetrical and asymmetrical shapes. Using resources from the snack table, they crafted intricate symmetrical patterns before enjoying their fruit and milk. The week concluded with the creation of stunning symmetrical butterflies, showcasing the children's creativity and understanding. Well done, Willows, on another week of remarkable learning experiences!





Science in the Oaks

This week, we have started work on our new science topic – Earth and Space. Our focus this week was understanding the solar system and our place within in. The children thoroughly enjoyed using Play Doh to represent the solar system; this activity challenged the children to apply their understanding of fractions to compare the relative sizes of the eight planets and develop a more detailed understanding of the solar system in which they live. Following this, the class used their deeper thinking skills to formulate questions about space. I have already been very impressed with the children's enthusiasm for, and prior knowledge of, this area of science.









Writers in Monkey Puzzles

In Year 6, our children have been busy honing their persuasive writing skills with a delightful twist! Engaging in the art of persuasion, they've tackled the topic of "Pet Peeves" with creativity and humour. Their informal - yet persuasive - texts not only showcase their hard work but also demonstrate a mastery of language that is both entertaining and compelling. Prepare to be amused as they skilfully articulate their frustrations with a dash of wit! Please do take the time to ask your child what they have been writing about- the pieces have delighted staff members!

PE in the Maples

The Maples enjoyed their first PE session of the half term with Kinetics this week. They were excited to see that they would be focusing on building up their throwing skills. In this week's lesson, the children focused on learning how to 'shot put' which involved them angling their arms in a way that would allow them to throw it as far as possible. By the end of the lesson, the children were ready for an element of competition to see who could throw it the furthest and red team came out on top!
