Design and Technology learning walk.

After collaborating with our TQ Hub partners and delivering professional development to the staff, our DT lead, Miss Blake, carried out a learning walk through Reception, KS1 and 2. The children were at various stages of their 7 steps to effective DT. Years 1 and 2 were in their planning and design phase. In Year 1, they were listing materials and tools they would need to build their freestanding structures and Year 2 were decided which aspects of their story book they would like to use leavers or sliders on. Year 5 are making seasonal bread and were at the prototype stage practicing the skills of measuring, mixing and kneading. Through conducting learning walks, we are able to work in collaboration with teachers to continually improve and develop our curriculum offer for our children.

Relationship and Health Education in the Hollies

For the next 4 weeks, Year 4 are focusing on the RHE topic of 'Work and Money'. On Tuesday, children discussed how a family might budget for a month. They did this by first looking at what different types of work people might do, and how these may look different, for example full, part time or voluntary work. They then looked at a bank statement for a month and answered questions such as, how much money has been withdrawn, what is the remaining balance and how much has been spent on charitable donations to a children's charity. The children were intrigued by the list of outgoings that occur on a monthly basis and had questions such as, 'Why do we need to pay bills?' and 'Why do some people give money to charity every month when other people don't?'.

DT in the Oaks

This week, the Oaks began their new food technology unit. The class have been tasked with creating a bread to share at a family picnic using seasonal ingredients. We thoroughly enjoyed tasting a wide variety of breads and discussing how they were similar and different. We then moved on to considering the technical skills we would need to make our own breads and practised these: measuring, mixing, kneading and dimpling. I cannot wait to see the final designs for our breads and for the children to bring these home to share with you at the end of term.

Geography in the Beeches

This week, the Year Twos have been busy using a whole range of aerial images and maps to locate some of the physical and human features in Brixham. As a class, we explored Brixham using Google Earth and pinpointed some of the key features of this fishing town. With our partners, we discussed how these features impact land use and spent some of the lesson discussing how the physical and human features support the fishing industry in Brixham. After exploring a range of images and maps, we went onto think about tourism and trade and discussed what the area has to offer those who wish to visit. Next week, we will be flying across the world as we explore a small town in New Zealand – how exciting!
