The Willows have been working hard to improve their fine motor control. This will then make their pencil control and handwriting/forming letters even better than it already is! We decided to dip marbles into different coloured paint and then used the trays to roll the marbles across the paper. This made a great marble effect and created some new shades where the marbles had rolled over different colours. Well, done Willows, great control.





Computing in the Beeches

The Beeches have been busy exploring the term 'data' and have gained an understanding of how tally charts and pictograms can be used to collect data. Once the children were familiar with the tern 'pictogram', they created their own pictograms manually to record data from within the classroom. After completing this, they progressed to creating pictograms using the computer. As a class, the children discussed the advantages of using computers rather than manual methods and spent time creating a whole range of pictograms to record different sets of data.

RHE in the Oaks

This week the Oaks have been busy working our Money and Work Unit in RHE. The children have been considering what skills and talents they possess and how they can take steps to develop these to maximises their chances of success in their chosen careers. Following this, we considered stereotypes, their impact in the workplace and how we can combat these. It was wonderful to see the children recognising their talents and voicing their opinions with clarity.

Hollies DT and Cluster Event

The Hollies have had some fabulous experiences this week to help them realise the possible. It is super difficult to choose just one......so I will choose two. In DT, the children carried out sensory evaluation as part of the research aspect of their topic to create a healthy snack bar. There were mixed reactions to the cranberries, golden raisins, glace cherries and pumpkin seeds, but the most divisive was definitely the dates. We had a Year 4 team building cluster with our sister schools Ellacombe and Warberry. The children loved catching up with friends that they made at residential, and it was a great opportunity for them to work in mixed teams to solve problems and overcome challenges.
