Orienteering in the Rowans

This week, the sun shone brightly for the Rowans Reach Outdoors session. The children took a stroll down to Stoodley Meadow to develop their map drawing skills and to learn about orienteering. Using their observational skills, they studied the surrounding area to draw their maps.



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They then applied their knowledge as geographers of compass points to pinpoint locations on their maps. It was wonderful to see the Rowans using their prior knowledge of maps, drawing map keys, and understanding cardinal points on a compass to support them during their session.





Writing in the Oaks

This half term in the Oaks we are focusing on writing to entertain. The children have enjoyed studying 'I Believe in Unicorns' by Michael Morpurgo and creating their own stories inspired by this historical narrative. Each child has shown an impressive improvement in their understanding of selecting vocabulary and grammar to appeal to their audience and have worked hard to draft and edit some brilliant pieces of writing. I have been very impressed with the development in writing standards shown by all of the class.

Dogs Trust Visit

We were thrilled to host the Dogs' Trust at our school this week for a series of engaging and educational workshops on how to stay safe around dogs. The visit provided our students with important knowledge and practical advice on responsible dog ownership and safe interactions with our furry friends.



The workshops were designed for all year groups and focused on key topics such as understanding a dog's body language, the importance of approaching dogs calmly, and what to do if a dog appears anxious or aggressive. Through interactive activities, videos, and discussions, the students learned how to read dogs' signals and respond appropriately.
