
Dear families

Snack Cafe maths in the Willows

There has been lots of maths learning in the Willow's this week. We find every opportunity to develop the children's knowledge of number sense and patterns in numbers. This week at the snack cafe the children have been exploring the number 10, and finding ways to partition 10 into two groups, using the 'part, part, whole' model. The children love this challenge and use this opportunity to investigate the different ways that their friends have made 10! Well done, Willows!





Awesome Animals in the Rowans

This week, the Rowans took on the role of scientists to learn about animal classifications. Using scientific enquiry skills, they asked questions to identify, sort, and classify different animals. Each child brought in a stuffed animal, and together we identified them by asking specific questions. We then classified the animals into various groups, such as those with legs vs. without legs, with fur vs. without fur, and with wings vs. with tails. It was a fun and educational experience that enhanced their understanding of animal diversity.







Choir Performance at the Devon County Show

Today saw the schools choir perform at the Devon County Show for the second year in a row. This is a fantastic opportunity for our children, and it was incredible to see children from EYFS all the way to Year 6 perform with such enthusiasm and joy.

Realising the Possible

Art in The Beeches

The children have been learning about the famous artist Lonnie Holley in our unit this half term, who is known for creating remarkable sculptures found from objects in the environment. Inspired by Holley's work, the children took on the challenge of creating their own sculptures using everyday materials such as recycled paper, cardboard, and plastic. We also went on a hunt in our school garden for some natural resources to use. They let their imaginations run wild as they transformed these materials into unique and creative pieces of art. After completing their sculptures, the children engaged in a thoughtful evaluation of their work. We are continuously impressed by the creativity and talent of our class, and we are thrilled to see them inspired by artists like Lonnie Holley. We certainly have some budding artists in our class family.











A Visit to Devon County Show for Hollies

We are thrilled to share the wonderful experience The Hollies had on their visit to the Devon County Show! This trip was a fantastic opportunity to enrich our science curriculum, specifically the topic of "Animals Including Humans."

The Devon County Show is renowned for its diverse array of animal exhibits, and we had the chance to see and interact with a variety of animals up close. From farmyard friends like sheep, cows, and pigs to more exotic species, the children were able to observe and learn about different animal characteristics and behaviours. We also got to see animal displays and the judging process in action. A highlight for us all, however, was watching our choir perform on one of the stages. We were very proud of their performance, and it was great to be in the audience to support them.

Computing in the Oaks

During Summer 1, our focus in computing has been on creating vector drawings. This week, the class worked on developing their understanding of layers and how they are used in vector drawings. They discovered that each object is built on a new layer and that these layers can be moved forwards and backwards to create effective vector drawings. The class observed how in nature there are lots of different layers. By layering other objects in front of their drawing, the class learnt how to make their own images blend in more. We are thoroughly enjoying this unit and I was impressed with the class's skills of resizing, alignment, copy and paste, zoom, and fill.



Historians in the Maples

As Historians, the Maples have spent this half term exploring the key question of 'how did Ancient Greece contribute to Modern Day life?' They have looked at who the ancient Greeks were, where they lived, how they were governed and how they became so powerful in the 5th and 6th century BC. We ended off this unit by looking at why the Olympics were so popular during this period and how it had contributed to the Olympics we know today. The children were really immersed in exploring how the events took place during this time and the similarities and differences to the events that we have in our Olympics in the modern day. They are already eager to start learning about other periods of time in History as they move into year 4.
