Stronger Together

NPQ Facilitation

Music in The Beeches

This week in our Music lesson, The Beeches class have been busy becoming musicians. We have been learning how to play the Glockenspiel and have already mastered our B note. Our goal is to create our own music patterns and pieces using a selection of notes and share with an audience. It has been wonderful to see the children's excitement and enjoyment when playing the glockenspiels as a class, experimenting with different sounds and rhythms. When we all hit the notes at the same time, it was perfect, and the concentration faces were in full swing! Pupil Questionnaire

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Geography in Hollies

Our key question this term in Geography is 'What are the key parts of the water cycle and how does it affect water moving around the Earth?' We looked at how the water cycle works and why it is vital to the Earths ecosystems. The children completed diagrams with the main processes and also discussed the importance of conserving water, and the use of waste/collected water for jobs that don't need fresh water, watering plants for example.

Preparing Fruit in the Rowans

This week in Design and Technology, the Rowans faced an exciting challenge: to design and create a healthy and delicious snack or drink made from fruits and vegetables. To start, the Rowans discussed important health and safety rules, including handwashing and safety tips for using utensils. The children were then given a variety of fruits and vegetables to work with, learning different preparation techniques such as peeling and slicing bananas and chopping carrots.

RHE in Monkey Puzzles

This week in RHE, the children have been learning about Mental Health. They have focussed on explaining mental health (in terms of what it means) and also considering different emotions and how they can sometimes take over the 'thinking part' of the brain. As part of this, they have been considering strategies they can use to support themselves to be mentally healthy and how to be a good listener. This learning has helped the Year 6's to talk about their up-coming transition to secondary school and continue preparation towards their incredible futures.

PE in the Oaks

This week the class started their two new units of PE: Alternative Sports and Athletics. During Alternative Sports, the class worked hard to develop their teamwork, movement and throwing skills during their first lesson of dodgeball with Kinetics. In Athletics, the class focused on their running skills. They learnt how to pace themselves for longer runs and competed in sprinting races. Over the half term, they will try out a variety of sports and ensure that they are all raring to go for Sports Day.



Maths in the Maples

This week, the children have been loving our new unit of shape. Over the past few lessons, they have learnt what a right angle is and how to identify them, all about parallel and perpendicular angles and obtuse and acute angles. They are retaining their new knowledge really well and have been able to apply this to their independent work. Many children have said this is the best unit we have done in Maths as it's fun and they're enjoying learning about different angles. This enthusiasm has been brilliant to see, and it is shining through in all our Maths lessons.

Geography in the Willows

This week we have started our new topic 'What It's like beside the sea..' We have been reading our favourite five story 'The Wide Wide Sea' the children were really interested on how we can look after our world and the ocean and how we can play our part in protecting the animals that live in the sea. The children had a wonderful discussion about what we can do to help the planet, and they now want to do a beach clean! We then looked at pictures of different beaches and discussed man made and physical features. We thought about our own visits to the beach and what we enjoy doing at the beach. Lots of children shared photos from their beach holidays and shared their experiences with their friends. Some children drew maps of the beach and their journey to get to the beach. Well done, Willows, such a fabulous week of learning!
