Sports Day

Marine Litter Workshop in the Hollies

The wonderful Alex visited The Hollies again this week and delivered a workshop on 'Marine

Litter'. She shared what marine litter is, how it gets into our oceans and seas and educated us on the impact this has on sea life. The statistics were shocking with 80% of marine litter coming from plastic, and 80% of that coming from the land. The children illustrated the durability of plastic by carrying out an experiment. In three bottles filled with water, the children put in a paper towel, a cotton bud and a wet wipe. After vigorously shaking the bottles, the children could see that all three objects were entirely intact, with no sign of them breaking down. To end the session, we went out on a litter pick outside of the school grounds. This is something the children said they would like to do more often as they said that they felt like they were 'making a difference'.



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
Sense of Belonging

'Recycle Devon' Workshop with The Beeches

This week in The Beeches, the children were super excited to be taking part in a composting and planting workshop with Alex (who we met last week in an assembly) from Recycle Devon. Alex began by talking to us all about waste and composting. Showing us where waste that isn't recycled goes now and what happens when we compost in a compost bin! We learnt about the different minibeasts that live in compost bins, if they were carnivores, omnivores or herbivores and we also shared our knowledge of what a plant needs to thrive – Alex was super impressed. The children enjoyed three engaging activities in a little carousel, making some little signs for their pots, exploring some real minibeasts with magnifying glasses and planting some different seeds. This hands-on experience was not only educational but also a great way to learn about sustainability and the environment around us.
